

EDUCATIONAL AND CAPACITY BUIULDING

HEALTH EQUITY

Implement targeted efforts to address the current "healthcare desert" that exists in Hyde Park by creating and building a desperately needed and dedicated Health & Wellness Center in Hyde Park to provide proactive medical care and alternative naturopathic therapies; This will close the gaps to accessible & restorative healthcare in the long term.
